Information Items

1. Bremerton National Airport Market Feasibility Study Update

CEO Jim Rothlin provided background on the Phase 1 process for the feasibility study and introduced consultant Kevin Mulcaster with Mead & Hunt, the consulting team charged with developing this study.

Mr. Mulcaster led off the presentation stating the intent of Phase 1 was to determine the feasibility of whether there is a market for either air service or passenger commercial service and/or air cargo service at Bremerton National Airport and what the community thinks about it. The following members of the consultant team continued the presentation within their areas of expertise:

Joseph Pickering presented on the air service component.

Levi Anstine presented the data analytics of the air service component findings.

Mr. Pickering continued with different airline model approaches and provided an air service summary stating there would be challenges but some airports have been successful with a multi-year effort.

Kirk Level presented on the air cargo service component summarizing at the conclusion of his presentation that air cargo service at Bremerton National would be extremely limited and not recommended.

Nicholas Mirra, Maul Foster Alongi, presented the Phase 1 public engagement summary stating there are strong feelings for and against new service with quality of life concerns higher than economic benefits. He provided the public's thoughts on what Phase 2 should examine if the Port decides to move forward.

Mr. Mulcaster closed the presentation by describing several opportunities for a deeper dive on issues raised by the community in Phase 2 should the Port move forward.

The presenters responded to questions and comments from the Board throughout the presentation.

Summary:

On May 22, 2024, the Port received qualifications for an Airport Feasibility Study. Mead & Hunt was awarded a contract for Phase 1 of a 2-phase study, which included a county-wide community survey regarding air service in Bremerton and an analysis of the feasibility of both Passenger and Cargo service.

After the completion of Phase 1, Mead & Hunt presented the results of the survey which summarized the desires and concerns of the community and the prospect of the demands of both passenger and cargo air service. The recommendation was that there is a demand for passenger service to limited destinations, and Phase 2 of the study would be helpful to continue to flush out the community concerns and to investigate the interest from airlines. As detailed in the original Request for Qualifications, the Port reserved the right to extend an offer to the contracted firm to negotiate services for Phase 2 of the project.

Fiscal Impact:

Capital Appropriations State Grant Ask: \$300,000 2025 FAA Master Plan grant \$215,000 Total Fee Proposal \$515,000

Strategic Purpose:

This action conforms with the Port's strategic plan in Goal 4 - Expand the Port's lines of business through routine assessment of new and expanded business opportunities.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends approval of the Agreement with Mead & Hunt to begin Phase 2 of the Feasibility Study to further assess the viability of commercial passenger air.

Motion for Consideration:

Move to approve the Agreement with Mead & Hunt for Phase 2 of the Feasibility Study and authorize CEO to execute the agreement.
